

A celebration of love, light

iwali or Deepavali, celebrated on Thursday October 31 and Friday November 1 this year, is a highly honoured event on the Hindu

Guru Kriba Vayapuri, a priest and retired school principal based in Durban, spoke to DurbanLocal on the significance of Diwali and why it is still celebrated after more than 2 500 years.

Guru Vayapuri said Diwali is also referred to as the festival of lights. But beyond that, the lighting of the clay lamp and its light is a celebration of the triumph of good over evil.

"Deepavali has now adopted an international status with celebrations taking place at centre stages in countries like the UK, Canada, USA, Malaysia, Singapore and Australia and here on our South Africa soil Deepavali is close to becoming a public holi-

day," said Guru Vayapuri.
"The entire globe is lit up with the shimmering clay lamps which compete with the stars in the heavens on Amavasya (darkest night), the night Deepavali is celebrated.'

Guru Vayapuri said the light-

ing of firecrackers and the kaleidoscope of fireworks decorating the sky sets the scene for the festival of lights.

Deepavali is a time when people forget their troubles and rejoice in the festivities, said Guru Vayapuri. The flickering flames of the lamps warms even the saddest heart. It's a day when loves reigns supreme, said Guru Vayapuri.

"Despite the brutal invasion of India by various foreign powers over thousands of years, Deepavali has remained intrinsic to Hindu culture, religion and tradition. Its spirituality and significance is what has made this festival withstand the test of time and survive against tremendous odds," said Guru Vayapuri.

He added that the significance of light to Hindus is synonymous to divinity because God is love and light, according to Hinduism. Light symbolises knowledge and darkness is tantamount to ignorance. Guru Vayapuri said along with lighting the external lamps, humanity should strive to light the lamps within them.

Stolen fireworks found at Phoenix temple

¬ APS officers recovered R4 million worth of stolen fireworks at a temple in Phoenix on October

The fireworks, intended for sale ahead of the Hindu Diwali festival, were linked to an armed robbery that took place in Camperdown just days earlier.

The robbery unfolded at a business premises in Camperdown, where armed suspects stormed the property, tied up security guards, and used two of their own trucks to steal trailers loaded with fireworks. The stolen goods were valued at approximately R4 million, and a case was opened at Camperdown

Metro police spokesman Captain Carmen Rhynes said, acting on intelligence, members of the SAPS Economic Infrastructure Task Team, with assistance from the Metro Drug team and SAPS Crime Intelligence, conducted a joint operation after receiving information about the possible location of the stolen stock.

"Their efforts led them to a Hindu temple in Phoenix, where three suspects were found offloading boxes

from a hired truck. Upon inspection, the goods were confirmed to be the stolen fireworks from the Camperdown robbery, marked with the owner's branding.

"The three suspects, aged between 34 and 42, were arrested for possession of stolen property. Alongside the 560 cases of fireworks, valued at R4 million, the truck used in the crime, valued at approximately R700 000, was also seized.

The Department of Human Settlements intends to partner with traditional leaders to identify disaster-resilient areas suitable for human settlements development, using geo-mapping.

Minister Mmamoloko Kubayi made the announcement at a meeting held with Members of Executive Councils (MINMEC) responsible for Human Settlements across the country on Thursday last week.

She said the collaborative initiative aims to enable traditional leaders to identify safe land parcels for settlement purposes and avoid disaster-prone areas in vulnerable provinces.

She said the department intends to pilot this approach in rural KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) and Limpopo provinces, paving the way for proactive disaster mitigation and sustainable human settlements.

"By leveraging geo-mapping technology, the department aims to inform decision makers to make better land allocation decisions, ensuring the safety and well-being of communities. We cannot be chasing after or reacting to disasters. We must be proactive and put measures in place to mitigate future disasters. Climate change is upon us, and we should be better prepared and be able to respond accordingly," Minister Kubayi said.

The Minister convened the meeting with the MECs, focusing on the 2024/2025 human settlements priorities. This was the second meeting in the seventh administration and included the Mayors and Members of Mayoral Committees (MMCs) for Human Settlements in metropolitan municipalities and representatives from the South African Local Government Association (SALGA) to tackle key critical areas.

Minister Kubayi said they want to prioritise vulnerable groups in housing allocation,

the Title Deeds Restoration Programme, housing for military veterans, emergency housing, and an update on the Human Settlements White Paper. The meeting discussed the finalisation of the White Paper and MINMEC was informed that extensive consultations have been undertaken to ensure that all sectors of the community took part in shaping the new

"Approved by Cabinet in 2023 for public consultation, the draft White Paper seeks to address the prevailing gaps and inconsistencies in the housing and human settlements sector by responding comprehensively to contemporary sector reforms," Ms Kubayi said.

The meeting heard that sectors including NGOs, civil society, labour, academics, developers and contractors, and identified government departments were consulted. The draft White Paper will be presented to Cabinet for approval, and once approved, a nationwide awareness campaign will be launched to educate the public on the policy's key points through various media channels.

The minister also under-

scored the importance of building integrated communities including rural areas, saying human settlements should be where people are, feel safe and have access to economic opportunities and social amenities.

"The government has availed resources to build social amenities in rural areas including community halls and other facilities to encourage development within the communi-

ties," the minister explained.
"Significant and severe disasters, affecting 51 to 100 or more households, will be jointly responded to by the National Department and provinces/metropolitan areas, while minimal and minor disasters, impacting 1 to 50 households, will be addressed by provinces working with metros."

Ms Kubayi said in response to disasters, the Emergency Housing Guidelines provide four key interventions, and these include restoration, rebuilding, relocation, and repairs. MINMEC emphasised the need to address historic disasters that occurred from 2019 to April 2024, which have affected numerous households, with estimated damages totalling R1 billion.

'Diwali is a day of

"Lighting an oil lamp with ghee (clarified butter), castor oil or sesame seed oil exudes positivity and generates its own field of energy. By lighting the lamp, an individual seeks to connect with their inner self (atma or soul) and embrace the qualities represented by the divine flame," he said.

Diwali is a day of introspection, reflection, rejuvenation and resolution – we should resolve to practise love and harmony, do good, share and care, said the Guru. He added that the important feature of Deepavali is the sharing of happiness by feeding the underprivileged and engaging in acts of poverty allevi-


"At Deepavali, homes are given a proper spring clean. Vibrant colours of rangoli (decorations made with rice) adorn the courtyards of many homes. The first lamp lit is in honour of Lord Yamraj, the Lord of Death. This is to pray that there is no untimely death in the home. Hindus believe in reincarnation of the soul and view death as a material transition from one state to another. The second lamp lit, two days before Deepavali, is for Dhanteras and this is for general well-being and good health. Dhanteras is considered the healer or father of Ayurvedic (herbal) medicine," said Guru Vayapuri.

The main day of Deepavali is when Mother Lutchmee (the Goddess of Wealth) is welcomed into homes and offices. Lamps are lit in every room in the house or office. Elaborate rituals and offerings are performed for her. Guru Vayapuri said rituals of worship are also performed for Shree Ram, Shree Krishna and Shree Hanuman.

"There are many legends surrounding the celebration of Deepavali. In the south of India, they commemorate the slaying of the demon, Narkasura, by Shree Krishna, While in the north of India, Shree Ram is celebrated for his victory over Ravana. The stories may not appeal to everyone however the spiritual message in the stories are of paramount importance – and that is the ultimate triumph of good over evil. The spirit of Deepavali is one of hope, faith and prosperity," he said.

It is because of this enduring hope we are reassured and reminded that beyond failure there is success beyond sorrow there is joy – beyond poverty there is prosperity - beyond suffering there is healing and beyond darkness there is light, said Guru

Lecturer in urgent need UKZN music of a stem cell donor

r Andrew Ross, a lecturer at the University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN) and devoted family man, has been given six to 15 months to live after being diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome (MDS), a rare type of blood cancer.

Now, he's fighting for a second chance at life and urgently requires a stem cell donor for a transplant.

A long-time blood donor, Dr Ross's world was turned upside down in March when a routine blood donation revealed alarmingly low haemoglobin levels.

'The finger prick test raised concerns," said DKMS, a non-profit organisation fighting against blood cancer.

"Further tests, including a bone marrow biopsy, confirmed the diagnosis of high-risk MDS, a condition that disrupts the normal production of blood cells in the bone marrow."

For Dr Ross, a stem cell transplant from a matching donor is the only hope for survival. Without it, doctors estimate his time is tragically short.

"The diagnosis has been devastat-

ing," Dr Ross said.
"It's news you can never prepare for. But instead of dwelling on the time I may not have, I'm choosing to turn this into a mission.

Determined to raise awareness about the lifesaving power of stem cell trans-

plants, Dr Ross has inspired a campaign that is spreading across social media, with his students leading the charge. The result has been an incredible outpouring of support, with more than 600 people registering as stem cell donors in the hope of saving his life.

Palesa Mokomele, head of community engagement and communications at DKMS Africa, praised Dr Ross's selflessness.

"Dr Ross has spent his life caring for others, and now he urgently needs help. We call on all healthy South Africans between the ages of 17 and 55 to register as stem cell donors. You could be the one to save his life.

The university has announced that the first Annual Music Showcase will be held on Friday November 1, and this will be followed by the 34th Annual UKZN Jazz Jol on Saturday November 2.

These two back-to-back events will feature a dynamic blend of performances, showcasing both the vibrant jazz tradition and the diverse musical talents nurtured within the UKZN

The festivities start on Friday November 1, with the UKZN School of Arts' Inaugural Music Showcase at the Elizabeth Sneddon Theatre.
