

Refurbishment on cards for Mansel Road Market

rban decay in eThekwini has set in with migration for economic opportunities, property abandonment, poor service delivery and crime being among the reasons for it.

These conditions were exacerbated, in part, by the catastrophic floods in April 2022, that destroyed critical infrastructure, including roads, communication and electrical systems.

To respond to the challenges of the municipality, President Cyril Ramaphosa established the eThekwini Presidential Working Group (PeWG) in April 2024.

The working group was established to accelerate support from national and provincial government to rebuild the municipality. Since its establishment, the working group has provided support and fast-tracked efforts by the eThekwini Municipality to improve service delivery, improve business confidence, and reposition eThekwini as an investment and tourism attrac-

The working group operates across three spheres of government and includes representatives from the private sector and

Last November, the eThekwini Metropolitan Municipality announced plans to develop the informal economy sector by upgrading the infrastructure used by traders.

These projects include the R10 million upgrade of the Dalton Art and Craft Market, the R15 million upgrade for the Mansel Road Market, the R2.5 million


upgrade for the Tongaat Trader Market, the R4 million upgrade for the KwaMaKhutha Business Hive (Ward 94) and the R4.3 million upgrade for the Klaarwater Business Hive (Ward 17).

Traders at the Mansel Road Market were visited by Small Business Development Minister Stella Ndabeni-Abrahams last

Norris the stork is back to make babies

orris the stork is back at Crocworld and he has some important work to do – making babies.

Norris was a captive hatchling who hatched at Johannesburg Zoo on January 1, 2010. He recently celebrated his 15th birthday.

Busani Mthiyane, animal curator of Crocworld Conservation Centre, said Norris arrived at Crocworld on July 20, 2015 where he enjoyed a happy time with his mates.

"Norris was housed in our Crocworld aviary for some time. He had been somewhat anxious and unsettled. However, with much dedicated care, he has calmed down significantly and we feel he is ready to be living with his mates once again," Mr Mthiyane said.

He added that Crocworld has many breeding programmes which are instrumental in furthering the genetic diversity of threatened species.

Norris has shown significant success in the programme, fathering a number of chicks over the years, including two last year. He added that they are patiently monitoring and observing Norris behaviour towards his mate.

The introduction of this Marabou stork comes with the intention of increasing their breeding rate as they have two males and one female on display. Marabou Storks breed during the dry season only and play an important role in the ecosystem by scavenging on carcasses, Mr Mthiyane

said.

So far Norris has fathered three children with his previous mate, Samara. Unfortunately Samara died and now he has a new mate, Merry.

"There is a need to breed more storks because the regional population of Marabou Storks in South Africa is relatively small, estimated at around 340 to 520 mature individuals.

"The Marabou Stork is currently classified as 'Least Concern' by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN). This makes them vulnerable to various threats, and breeding programmes help stabilise

and potentially increase their numbers. These programmes also enhance genetic diversity which is crucial for the long-term health and resilience of the species," said Mr Mthiyane.

Mr Mthiyane said Marabou Storks are not known to be friendly or playful, however, during the breeding season, males perform courtship displays to attract females. This includes bill-clattering and spreading their wings. These unique displays intend to establish dominance and attract a mate, he said.

"Norris is certainly one of the beloved characters at Crocworld, and

we're excited to be introducing him to the public once again. He is joined by many fantastic characters that reside at Crocworld, among them Henry the Nile crocodile.

"Henry is considered the world's longest-living Nile crocodile in captivity, he just celebrated his 124th birthday. There's his best mate, Colgate, who is in his 90s and almost as massive as Henry. Then there's Elliot the Emu, and Sekhuru the African Fish Eagle.

"We encourage visitors to head to Crocworld to meet them all," said Mr Mthiyane.





Man gets life sentence for crime spree

In March 2022, Siyabonga Prince Cele went on a crime spree in Inanda and Phoenix. He was eventually apprehended when police confronted him at a petrol station. He was in possession of a stolen vehicle.

This week the Ntuzuma Regional Court sentenced Mr Cele, 23, to a term of life and 25 years imprisonment for rape, robbery with aggravating circumstances, attempted murder and kidnapping

kidnapping. National Prosecuting Author-

ity (NPA) regional spokesperson, Natasha Ramkisson-Kara, said on March 12, 2022 Mr Cele and other accomplices hijacked a motor vehicle in the Inanda area.

"The complainant, who worked as a metered-car driver, was dropping off a passenger when Cele and his accomplices approached him (the driver) with knives and firearms.

"They assaulted him, pulled him out of the vehicle and drove off. They then came across the female complainant who was walking in the road. They grabbed her and forced her into the back seat of the motor vehicle"

Ms Ramkisson-Kara said Mr Cele forced her to undress and when she refused, he stabbed her on various parts of her body. He eventually raped her. Thereafter they found a bank card in her possession and drove to a petrol station where they filled up the vehicle.

"At the petrol station, they were approached by police officials who had identified the vehicle as being stolen. Cele and the suspects then fired several shots at the police as they fled the scene.

"However, they crashed the motor vehicle and Cele was apprehended. The complainant who was found bleeding in the backseat of the vehicle was taken to the Phoenix Thuthuzela Care Centre, for medical and psycho-social assistance," said Ms Ramkisson-Kara.

In court, Advocate Naushaad

Harripersadh led the testimonies of the three complainants: the driver, the woman and the police official who was shot at by Cele and his accomplices.

DNA evidence linking Cele to

the rape; crime scene evidence, and medical evidence (J88 form) were also part of the State's case.

The metered-car driver said that his sole income and livelihood were destroyed as the vehicle was damaged beyond repair.

The woman said that she had suffered physical and emotional trauma during the incident. She also mentioned that she had to leave the area and relocate because she lived in fear, following what had happened to her.

"Cele was sentenced to life imprisonment for rape, 15 years imprisonment for robbery with aggravating circumstances, 5 years imprisonment for attempted murder, and 5 years imprisonment for kidnapping.

"The sentences will run concurrently, resulting in the effective sentence of life imprisonment.

"In addition, the court declared him unfit to possess a firearm and ordered that his details be entered in the National Register for Sex Offenders," said Ms Ramkisson-Kara.

Charges dropped against missing man's alleged kidnappers

Esmael Maulide Ramos Nangy, Stefane Pereira Da Costa Brites, and Samkeliso Honest Mlotshwa appeared at the KwaDukuza Magistrate's Court on Wednesday January 22. The accused face charges of kidnapping, extortion and attempted murder.

Their appearance relates to the September 2024 kidnapping of a KwaDukuza businessman, said National Prosecuting Authority regional spokesperson, Natasha Ramkisson-Kara.

"After a careful consideration of the matter, including consultations with the relevant stakeholders, the State has decided to withdraw charges against all three accused," said Ms Ramkisson-Kara. "Charges against the accused of kidnapping businessman, Zakariyya Desai, outside a mosque in KwaZulu-Natal have been withdrawn."

Mr Desai who owns Desai's

Cash and Carry, was taken by force in September 2024, after attending a night prayer.

The suspects were driving a silver VW Polo. The assailants fired several shots as others tried to stop the kidnapping, said Ms Ramkisson-Kara.

One of the accused, Mr Mlotshwa is a policeman employed with the South African Police Services.

Motorists warned of hijacking tactic

Motorists are being urged to remain vigilant after a recent incident on the N2 Freeway in Durban highlighted a dangerous tactic being used by criminals to target drivers.

Reaction Unit South Africa's Prem Balram said last Saturday evening, a nurse travelling with her family between Spaghetti Junction and Westwood Mall reported running over metal debris that appeared to have been deliberately placed on the road. The debris caused extensive damage to one tyre and minor damage to another.

"Shortly after her tyres were affected, a Toyota Corolla pulled up behind her vehicle, and a loud noise was heard, heightening her suspicion. Fearing for their safety, the nurse and her family continued driving with the damaged tyre until they

reached a secure location, at which point the suspicious vehicle stopped following them," said Mr Balram.

He said this modus operandi has been previously linked to hijacking attempts, where criminals place objects on the road to damage vehicles, forcing drivers to stop in places where they are vulnerable.

Mr Balram offered the following tips to drivers to ensure their safety:

• Avoid stopping in isolated areas. If your vehicle is damaged, continue to a safe, well-lit location before pulling over.

• Be cautious of vehicles following closely. If a car behaves suspiciously behind you, do not stop. Instead, drive to the nearest police station or secure area.

• Report road hazards. If you notice debris on the road, report it to authorities immediately.

Boost for informal traders

"This doesn't happen anywhere on the continent where the government freely provides equipment to informal traders. This shows us that our government is taking care of us," he said.

eThekwini Municipality senior manager for the informal economy, Michael Hlangu, said the Mansel Road Market was a hive of activity during weekends.

He said customers come from all over South Africa and other countries on the continent. The retail market offers among others clothing, food stalls, traditional drums, bedding, and traditional attire. About 180 traders operating at the market are expected to benefit from the refurbishment of the facility. This will include a new building with new ablution facilities, electricity, water and a parking area.

"We have 184 container traders. Some of the containers are dilapidated. Our plan is to convert the containers into brick and mortar. Contractors have been appointed for the project and the traders will be relocated this month to a new location so the construction of the project can commence," said Mr Hlangu. "During the construction phase it is anticipated that about 100 people will benefit from job opportunities. All traders that are

operating in this facility have been registered with the municipality."

The majority of traders have business licences and they renew them on an annual basis, Mr Hlangu added. The rental for the food section is R664 per month and they sign a lease agreement with the municipality.

Mr Hlangu added that they regularly conduct training on health and safety to ensure that the vendors comply with the regulations and by-laws.

The municipality is responsible for maintaining the facility, which includes providing security, cleaning services and electricity.

Mr Qwabe said the municipality hosts business summits each year and updates traders on the work being done to uplift the informal economy.

"There is work that has been done to improve the operations of the traders. When this place was opened in 1996, there were no containers. People were selling from their cars under the carport, and this was changed to containers, but the containers have deteriorated over the years," he said. "The municipality has come to assist the traders as they are now building a new structure for traders.

"We have seen the plan and it's good. We will be able to attract tourists with the new building."





Competition invites citizens to tell water story

The Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) has called on the public to take part in the Citizen Science for Water Photo Story Competition, which is aimed at communicating matters of water action in creative ways.

The South African National Committee (SANC) for the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) Intergovernmental Hydrological Programme (IHP), in collaboration with the DWS, launched the Citizen Science for Water Photo Story Competition in September last year.

SÂNC members include the DWS, the Water Research Commission (WRC), Department of Science and Innovation (DSI), University of South Africa (UNISA), and the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE), among

The department said the competition seeks to raise awareness on the intertwined relationship between water and the various dimensions of culture, value, edu-

cation and the natural sciences. Focusing on demonstrating how citizens, communities and education could effectively support the sustainable use and management of water, among others.

"It is also aimed at activating youth involvement in communicating matters of water action in creative ways. As well as contribute to joint actions in the water action agenda, and to demonstrate how citizens, communities and education could effectively support the sustainable use and management of water," the department said in a statement.

The department also highlighted that the competition targets citizens from all walks of life with a keen interest on water matters, including citizen science organisations, related civil society groups, as well as visual artists and photographers.

Participants are encouraged to explore and submit photo stories aligned with five themes, including Water and Citizen Science; Water and Partnerships; Water and Education; Water and Culture, as well as Water and Communities.

"The competition is open to South African individuals aged 18 and above Participants should submit a minimum of three photographs that tell a cohesive story on one of the five themes, along with title, overall story of 200 to 500 words, names of the author(s) and photograph location in South Africa," the department said.

Entries for the competition is open and can be accessed on the UNESCO website https://www.dws.gov.za/Projects/UNESCO/cspi.aspx

The deadline for submission is Wednesday March 26. The winners will be announced in April and receive an award from DWS and SANC-IHP.

"The winning entries will gain visibility through local and international UNESCO IHP platforms, where the top 15 pieces will be featured in an exhibition during the launch of the Photo Story Book in June 2025," the department said.

The department urged participants to familiarise themselves with the submission rules when entering the competition. Anyone with enquiries or struggling with their submission may direct their queries to ihp50photostory@dws.gov.za.

Poetry contest commemorates Madiba's education

This year Poetry Africa will commemorate the centenary of the late former president Nelson Mandela's school year. The "Centenary of Mandela's School Year" theme is education is power and it will commemorate Mr Mandela's first school year, driving the 2025 Poetry Africa programme.

The Nobel laureate and first president of South Africa's constitutional democracy, Mr Mandela, started his primary schooling near his village of Qunu in the Eastern Cape in January 1925, said Siphindile Hlongwa, the curator of the Poetry Africa Festival.

"Mr Mandela grew up to acknowledge education as a powerful platform that could bring about equality and promote tolerance. We are delighted to launch two special projects at a time when young people across South Africa will be returning to school or starting school for the first time.

"The Poetry Africa programmes are our creative response to remind our nation about the important value that Mr Mandela placed on education," said Ms Hlongwa.

She drew on a famous quote from Mr Mandela, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."

Ten finalists from the national Slam Poetry Competition will be recorded for a special programme to be broadcast across several radio stations in South Africa in partnership with the Radiocracy project. The 10 finalists will have their poems recorded for broadcast with a network of radio stations

They will each receive a royalty fee for their recorded performance and a book voucher.

The Poetry Africa Festival is also kicking off a monthly slam poetry competition aimed specifically at slam poets from the greater Ethekwini municipality.

The winner of each month's competition between January and August will receive a R1 000 prize. The eight monthly winners will also be invited to a mentorship programme in September follow-

ing which they will be presented in a specially curated programme at the Poetry Africa Festival in October 2025, said Ms Hlongwa.

Published poet, Andisa Mpisi, an Emerging Arts Manager at the Centre for Creative Arts, will co-ordinate the programmes.

Ms Mpisi participated in the centre's literature curator exchange programme with the Bergen Literature Festival in Norway in 2024.

"We want slam poets to use their creative voices to encourage young people to immerse themselves in education by drawing inspiration from Nelson Mandela's commitment to education", said Ms Mpisi.

"In his biography, Long Walk to Freedom, Mr Mandela said 'the power of education extends beyond the development of skills we need for economic success. It can contribute to nation-building and reconciliation'.

"Mr Mandela also said, 'young people must take it upon themselves to ensure that they receive the highest education possible so that they can represent us well in future as future leaders'."

Lauren developed an interest in writing at high school, and since then she made her dreams come true and became an author.



Alas, no we are not. While elsewhere in the world romance characters have become more diverse, in South Africa we are still lagging behind in this department.

This story, set in San Diego, is about Rose, a semi-conservative office worker with a highly-detailed life plan.

Her plan goes off the rails when three months after she had scheduled her engagement on her colour-coded Excel spreadsheet life plan, her relationship with her long-term boyfriend Patrick appears to be going in the opposite direction instead.

She finds solace in game night, a weekly meet-p with her set of quirky friends and archnemesis to play board games.

When a competition to develop a new board game has her digging out and re-evaluating her own unfinished game, she finds a new unmapped life goal that ignites in her a long-



lost excitement.

The only person who can help her get the game competition-ready though is her sexy rival William, whose teasing and dour aloofness has long ago put them at odds.

Throw in a creepy boss, some family drama, wedding plans and pole dancing and you've got the bones of this novel, which is fleshed out quite nicely since the author hasn't sacrificed whole chapters to spicy scenes.



Hans is back home after solo seafaring

There is no place like home and this rings true for Hans Hamre.

Mr Hamre is an alumnus and former University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN) economics lecturer, who swapped his career as an investment analyst for a life of adventure. After retiring he set sail to see the world.

He lived in London for over 32 years. He was inspired to take up sailing as he reflected on how to make the most of his life. Driven by the sobering reality of friends experiencing premature deaths or uninspiring retirements, he decided he was going to do things differently.

At 57, Mr Hamre purchased a 40-foot Dufour yacht, named *Manuka*, resigned from his job, and rented out his house before setting sail across the Atlantic Ocean to the Caribbean Islands. Little did he know that his journey would eventually bring him back to his hometown of Durban three years later.

"I initially spent two years in the Caribbean exploring the different islands, including a five-month stint where I visited Columbia, Panama and Costa Rica," he said.

After reaching Central America in mid-2023, Mr Hamre sailed through the Pacific, making it as far as Fiji.

Toward the end of the year, he continued to New Zealand, where he spent

six months. By July 2024, his voyage took him to Australia, across the Indian Ocean to Mauritius, the Réunion Islands, and finally back home to Durban.

"The journey from Réunion to Durban was particularly gruelling," Mr Hamre said. "It took 12 days to cover 1 450 nautical miles. It was fairly slow, and

after sailing so much over the past four months, I was eager to get home, which made it frustrating."

Mr Hamre faced several challenges during the 12-day voyage, including malfunctioning sliders and a failed water pump. Fortunately, the wind picked up enough for the foresail alone to be sufficient, so he didn't need the mainsail sliders, he said. He added that he relied on 5-litre plastic bottles refilled from 20-litre Jerry cans because the water tanks were out of service.

"I come from a lineage of seafarers. My father, Erik, was a whaler, captain and gunner for the Union Whaling Company, operating out of Durban until it closed in 1975. My grandfather, Hans, served as a war sailor. Reflecting on my journey, I never imagined I would one day follow in their footsteps, sailing solo across the Indian Ocean and into the Port of Durban," said Mr Hamre.

His arrival in Durban was made even more special by the welcoming party of old friends.

He said he was looking forward to a break from the sea with a vacation in the Drakensberg Mountains. "I've had enough of water to last me a while," he said.

The final event for the 2024/25 Summer Sailing Season before the annual MSC Week, is the Sunshine Series on Sunday May 18 and Sunday June 22.

"Nearing 50 years since its inception, the MSC Week that began in 1976 is five days of offshore yachting at its finest in Durban's magnificent winter conditions.


